

Victoria Rodríguez Ceja

Victoria Rodríguez was appointed governor of Banco de México from January 1, 2022 to December 31, 2027, after being nominated by Mexico's president and confirmed by the Senate of the Republic.

Governor Rodríguez has a bachelor's degree in Economics from *El Instituto Tecnológico de Estudios Superiores de Monterrey* (ITESM) and master's studies in Economics from *El Colegio de México*. She has over 20 years of experience in public finance, specializing in budgetary, financial, and debt issues.

Before being appointed Banco de México's governor, she served as deputy minister of Expenditure at the Ministry of Finance and Public Credit from December 2018 to December 2021. Among her responsibilities, she was in charge of designing the preliminary draft of the Federal Expenditure Budget presented to Congress, of reviewing and authorizing the Federal Government expenditure policies, and of coordinating the analysis and evaluation of the annual results of budgets and programs of all public administration entities.

She has held different positions at the Ministry of Finance of Mexico City. She was deputy minister of Expenditure at the Ministry of Finance of Mexico City from April 2012 to March 2018, and was in charge of issuing regulations and guidelines to elaborate the Annual Operative Program, the preliminary draft of the Expenditure Budget, Quarterly Reports, and Mexico City's Public Accounts.

Previously, from February 2012 to April 2012, she was advisor to the minister of Finance of Mexico City. In August 2009, she was appointed director general of Budget Policy at the Ministry of Finance of Mexico City, where she served until November 2011. As part of her responsibilities, she integrated Mexico City's Public Administration Operative Program and the preliminary draft of Mexico City's Public Administration Expenditure Budget.

From March 2009 to July 2009, Governor Rodríguez served as general director of Expenditure at the Ministry of Finance of Mexico City, where she coordinated the budgetary planning of several entities of Mexico City's Government. From March 2004 to February 2009, she was finance director of Mexico City's Subway Public Transportation System. She has also held the positions of director of Debt (January 2002 to February 2004) and deputy director of Public Debt Surveillance (January 2001 to January 2002) at the Ministry of Finance of Mexico City.

In all her various public service positions, Governor Rodríguez has promoted the modernization and greater efficiency of all budget design and supervision processes, debt

placement, and management of financial schemes. Her duties have also implied a careful follow-up of both the national and international macroeconomic environment, as well as major financial and monetary policy issues.
